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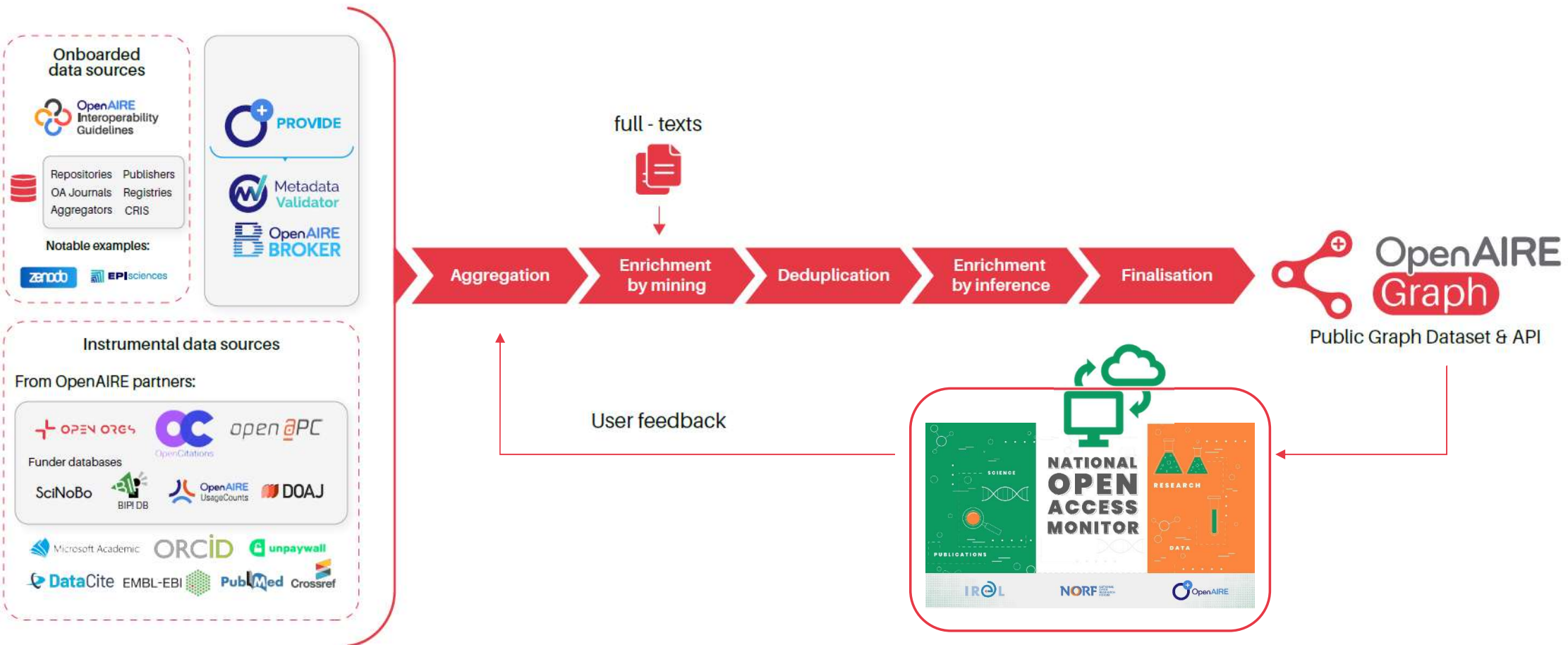

Objectives

- Showcase Ireland's research landscape and OA progression
- **View indicators**
 - Highlight **OA uptake** indicators
 - Enable **cross-country** benchmarking
 - Offer detailed **breakdowns** and **filtering** by RPO, RFO, year (range), and more
- **Increase quality of the underlying ecosystem**
 - Access to the **Sandbox** to verify data quality (e.g., if a new repository is harvested, deduplication in OpenORGS, etc.)
 - Access to **OpenORGS** tool to deduplicate organization name (RPOs)
 - Authorize OpenAIRE to enhance ORCID profiles.
 - Identify & **CLAIM** research outputs for addition to both Monitor and ORCID (with granted permission).

Data Quality

- Deduplication, enrichment and cleaning in OpenAIRE
- Disambiguation of Journals, Publishers and Licenses

Additional Data Quality Enhancements

- **RPOs:** Deduplication via OpenORGS
- **RFOs:** Provide Funding data for custom text mining
- **Repositories:** Register with OpenAIRE Provide
- **Researchers:** Claim research outputs
- **All:** via linking functionality

Lessons learnt from the NORF community

- First assess the situation, to identify gaps
- Develop an actionable roadmap
- Involve all stakeholders (in parallel other projects, e.g., repository network)
- Make simple rules, and stick to them
- Re-evaluate before next phase
